Background and Objectives

Task Definition:

Develop and implement a training program for the African end-users of the CBERS images.

- The programme fosters:
 - Use of freeware and open-source geo-processing software (e.g. SPRING and TerraView)
 - 2. Development of remote-sensing applications using CBERS images. Initial focus will be on users in Lusophone African countries.





Outputs: planned

- Development of training material in Portuguese, English and French.
- Accreditation of institutions in Africa for training.
- Set up a global network of specialized training centers: virtual laboratory for education and training in use of Geoinformation and remote sensing by satellite.
- Implementing two levels of training: technical and postgraduate education:
 - Technical level: blended course, containing both face to face and online elements. After completing the in-classroom module, students should develop a work for the application of the knowledge acquired involving a practical situation in their countries of origin, interacting through the Internet.
 - Postgraduate education in Remote Sensing (INPE). The acceptance in the post-graduation program at INPE must follow the normal procedures for students' selection.





Milestones achieved to date

- ✓ Visit to Mozambique CENACARTA (National Center for Remote Sensing and Cartography) has been identified as the Contact Institution in Mozambique (2008)
- ✓ Acceptance of one student, from Mozambique, for Masters Degree at the Remote Sensing Postgraduate Program (INPE). Fellowship will be provided by Brazilian Government. (2009)
- ✓ MOU: RCMRD X INPE
 - ✓ The Regional Centre for Mapping of Resources for Development (RCMRD)
 and the Brazilian National Institute for Space Research (INPE) signed an
 MOU which aims at encouraging the use of earth observation data in Africa
 and enhancing earth observation infrastructure and capacity
 building/training. (2009)
