- ACTION 233-06 follow-up: SIT Chair Team has invited GEO Secretariat to present on their engagement with UNOOSA on SDGs and GEO Secretariat has accepted invitation; agenda item has been added to the SIT-33 agenda. This action can be closed.

- SIT-33 preparations are underway and registration link is now live on CEOS website under the meetings tab. Version 0 Draft of agenda shared with SEC. SEC is requested to review and provide comments for next draft version. Please note that designated presenters are still TBC and if anyone would like to confirm they are willing to give the presentation where their name is listed, please let Kerry know.
- Status of the VC and WG Questionnaires and Tag-ups completed all but two VC tag-ups (one will be completed later on 22nd, leaving P-VC only outstanding)
 - o Had great discussions with all the VC Co-Leads and WG Chairs
 - Still would like to receive questionnaires from many one-generation removed leaders (past WG Chairs, past SIT Chair teams, etc.). Will follow up with another invitation to participate.
- Outcomes from 8th GEO Programme Board
 - O Three new PB subgroups added to the two existing subgroups (Paris Agreement and Regional GEOSSs CEOS (Steven Hosford, Pascal Lecomte, and Kerry Sawyer participate on the Paris Agreement subgroup). Three new subgroups are: Sendai Framework subgroup, Work Programme Monitoring subgroup, and Sustainable Earth Observations subgroup. CEOS has proposed membership on all three subgroups (strong-armed/voluntold for participation in one, volunteered for two) but we need to identify individuals to participate (you do not have to be recognized Agency PB member to participate membership is open to anyone from the organization/agency).
 - Victim of our own successes clearly there is no "terrestrial CEOS' but our expertise
 is requested to help develop best practices to facilitate coordination of in-situ
 observations and integrate with space-based observations (we will NOT merge the
 two foundational tasks on in-situ and space-based).
 - O Agreed that the Land Degradation Neutrality Initiative will be accepted as a Community Activity for the latest update to the GEO Work Programme (only requires GEO Secretariat approval) with the expectation that UNCCD will work with interested and invited participants to further develop the proposal to become a GEO Initiative, which will be made at the October GEO Plenary. We ensured that the language that is in the updated proposal has softened to ensure CEOS resources have not been prematurely committed. We will discuss the LDN, and potential CEOS Agency contributions, at SIT-33.

- PB is working with GEO Secretariat to identify Work Programme opportunities for commercial sector engagement and Secretariat took an action to inventory list of all commercial sector involvement in GEO activities to be presented at next PB.
- o GEO Symposium, 9th GEO Programme Board, and Paris Climate Agreement Workshop will all three be held week of 11 June in Geneva.

Updates on issues raised during the <u>last</u> CEOS SEC teleconference (Dot points)

The relationship between UNOOSA and GEO was discussed at CEOS-GEO sec bilateral meeting (29-30th February), so action item No. 233-05 was closed. Instead, a new action item No. 223-06 was created. In response to No, 233-06, GEO Secretariat will present the scope of GEO's engagement with UNOOSA at SIT-033.

- 8th GEO Work Programme Board was held on 31 January-2 February in Geneva.
- The meeting started with "Lead GEO Co Chair Goals and Objectives for 2018" followed by "WP support for Policy Initiatives (Paris Agreement and Sendai framework, SDGs,)"," Leveraging Regional GEOSS Initiatives", "Monitoring WP Implementation", "GEO Symposium" and "Commercial Sector engagement".
- A draft concept note for GEO Paris agreement workshop was proposed by the Subgroup on Paris Agreement workshop. The workshop will take place twice. 1st workshop is on 13th June in Geneva focusing on EO communities, UN agencies and selected national practitioners. 2nd workshop is planned in Autumn (TBD) expanding target audience to policy makers. The workshop covers not only mitigation but also loss and damage, adaptation, capacity development/technology transfer and national reporting/global stocktake.
- Sendai Framework subgroup was formed. CEOS became a member. James Norris, a new virtual secondee at GEO Secretariat from the UK will lead this group. This subgroup will review disaster activities in the GEO WP, map activities in support of Sendai Framework and identify the gaps. The outcome will be reported to GEO plenary 2018 and 2019 GEO ministerial meeting as well as become input to UN custodian agencies (UNISDR, UNGGIM)
- A new WP activity proposal of "Land Degradation Neutrality Initiative" was proposed by GEO secretariat. It will be reviewed by PB members. Lead Scientist of UNCCD(UN Convention for Combat Desertification) made address for GEO's support for monitoring SDG15.3.1, proportion of land that is degraded over total land area.
- Work Programme Monitoring subgroup (develop user metrics, investigating commercial sector engagement, KPI refinement, etc.) and Sustainable Earth Observation subgroup (define integration of in-situ and satellite observation to support high priority policy engagements, coordination of in-situ observation, etc.) were formed. CEOS will participate in both subgroups. ToR will be developed by the next PB meeting.

PB agreed to hold GEO symposium on 11-12 June in Geneva, because the survey by GEO sec shows positive results towards having this symposium. Back to back with Paris Agreement workshop and 9th PB meeting. GEO secretariat will make an announcement for these symposia soon to ask saving date.

- GEO Carbon and GHG Initiative (GEO-C) formed a Steering Committee and 1st meeting of the steering committee took place in Geneva on 2 February. Steering committee participants included high-level representatives from GEO Members Japan and the European Commission, and many of GEO's climate Participating Organizations, including the Global Climate Observing System (GCOS), World Meteorological Organization (WMO), United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), Committee on Earth Observation Satellites (CEOS), Integrated Carbon Observation System (ICOS) alongside the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC).
- Han Dolman of the Free University of Amsterdam accepted the role of Chair, and Werner Kutsch of ICOS and Hiroyuki Muraoka of Japan as Vice Chairs.
- The committee agreed the need to identify the complementary roles and responsibilities within the carbon observation landscape, finding that GEO-C can provide a global forum for highly-valuable informal discussions. The GEO-C is planning to identify observational requirements for disciplines beyond traditional meteorological and climate data, and define requirements for a global carbon monitoring system. The GEO-C Secretariat is also working to map the carbon observations landscape, with the goal to support planning, outreach and communication efforts. Outcomes of this meeting, next steps and detailed objectives for GEO-C will be outlined in a forthcoming White Paper, which will include a common roadmap.

- The Open Data Cube community just completed its 2nd conference in Canberra, Australia on Feb 12-16. There were 50+ people in attendance from GA, CSIRO, USGS, SEO, UK-Catapult, UK-Rhea, and Colombia. The developer team made good progress on a number of technical fronts with several tasks focused on rapid data cube deployment. The "partners forum" worked on strategic planning and goals for 2018, including a comprehensive status of ARD, improved ODC code and application organization, improved training and capacity building materials, and a communications plan.
- On January 31, 2018, Brian Killough was the invited guest speaker at the University of Geneva in Switzerland. Approximately 100 people attended, including students and faculty from the University and members of the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP). The presentation focused on the latest trends in global satellite data use, the vision of the Open Data Cube initiative and new open source application products available to Swiss users.

 - SDCG Hands-on call to be planned in the end of Feb.
 - Per SEC action 231-06, the SDCG Co-Chairs are working on a paper on SDCG resourcing to be presented at SIT-33.
- GFOI Plenary Planning (Hosted by IDEAM, Bogota, Colombia, week of March 12th)
 - Preparations are underway including SDCG-13. Participation from the usual SDCG agencies is light for SDCG-13, with USGS, CNES, CSA, and ASI all absent relative to SDCG-12.
 - A side meeting of CEOS Data Cube, including Vietnam (VNSC), Taiwan (in support of Honduras), and Colombia will be hosted by IDEAM in the margins with the intention of sharing experience and lessons learned.
 - Some pushback on dedicating too much Plenary agenda time to CEOS' contributions, with the preferred focus being on user needs and support. Drift in the focus of GFOI needs to be monitored by CEOS members.
- GFOI Lead Team meeting (Paris, Feb 2nd)

- Osamu (CEOS Lead) and Frank Martin Seifert (ESA Lead) attended and noted the meeting was well attended by the Leads (including three World Bank representatives).
- General shifting momentum as GFOI Phase 2 to more on user needs in forestry countries. GFOI 'Early Warning' activity is expected to be significant topic of discussion relevant to CEOS in GFOI Phase 2.
- Data component scoping on how to access, process, integrate datasets and deliver derived information in more general architectural level is expected to be discussed.
- The establishment of a Data User Advisory Group (DUAG), as well as a properly resourced GFOI R&D programme were both discussed by the Leads.
- CEOS Lead asked the GFOI Leads what they expected of CEOS for GFOI Phase 2, and will push for GFOI Plenary to make a statement on both future plans and past successes. CEOS lead will then bring this statement back to the SIT-33 meeting in April, and in turn ask CEOS senior leadership to confirm their intentions for GFOI Phase 2.
