Main 2018 SIT Technical Workshop Outcomes

Climate and Carbon Observations

- 1. A proposal for structured collaboration between CEOS and CGMS on Greenhouse Gas (GHG) monitoring to be taken forward by the CEOS-CGMS Working Group Climate (WGClimate) was discussed and will be refined before being presented to Plenary for endorsement.
- 2. WGClimate and AC-VC will jointly progress implementation of the GHG Constellation White Paper activities.
- 3. Review period for the Second Order Draft of the **IPCC Good Practice Guidance for GHGs** has closed and inputs on the Final Government Distribution via national governments January-March 2019.

Data

- 4. Progress across the **Future Data Architectures (FDA)** areas of focus (ARD, Data Cubes, EO Platforms, User Metrics, Data Analytics) was reviewed, with the proposed way forward focusing on cross-group coordination.
- 5. Analysis Read Data (ARD) is no longer a desire of global users but is now becoming a requirement and an expectation. LSI-VC, along with WGCV is progressing the development and fostering implementation of CARD4L.
- 6. WGISS is progressing the **Carbon Community Portal** to facilitate the discoverability and accessibility of Essential Climate Variable (ECV) products and space-borne Climate Data Records (CDRs).
- 7. The **SEO** has been asked to engage in the GA-lead Digital Earth Africa, and have requested that Brian Killough be the CEOS representative pending Plenary endorsement.

User Engagement Activities

- Five options for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) ad hoc Team were presented at CEOS SIT-33 for discussion and decision at CEOS Plenary, with preference from the AHT leadership for creation of a third thematic Working Group.
- 9. **Data provision for new Disasters initiatives** endorsed at SIT-33 is being progressed by WG Disasters, with the exception of CSA.
- 10. CEOS support for **GFOI Phase 2** is now being developed with increased user focus. There are opportunities to promote emergent CEOS Agency data streams (e.g. biomass, L-band SAR).
- 11. **GEOGLAM** is moving towards operations which is changing and expanding data requirements, and the AHWG will request an additional year for consultation at Plenary.

Oceans and Water Cycle

- 12. **COVERAGE** has completed a review of candidate interagency satellite data products across the four ocean Virtual Constellations (SST, Winds, SSH, Ocean Color) for inclusion in a set of global baseline products.
- 13. SST-VC reports that **Passive Microwave continuity** may be bolstered by Copernicus (CIMR) and JAXA (AMSR2 follow-on) in the 2022-2025 timeframe.
- 14. OST-VC is updating its **altimetry user requirements** addressing evolving user needs, swath altimetry, and recommending an "operational constellation" in support of the long-term sea level record.

- 15. OSVW-VC noted discussions underway on OSVW data exchange with Chinese agencies.
- 16. An invitation-only 3-day **Freshwater from Space Workshop** is being organized to work towards providing CEOS agencies with consolidated user requirements on measurable parameters.
- VC, WG, and AHT Sustainability
- 17. Adjustments to **CEOS Work Plan reporting** were proposed and will be trialed for CEOS Plenary.
- 18. The SDCG, GEOGLAM, and SDG ad hoc Teams will request one year extensions at Plenary.
- 19. A proposal for a **joint way forward for the LSI-VC, SDCG, and GEOGLAM groups** was presented which would see them consolidate as of Plenary 2019, with a detailed plan to be presented at Plenary.

Partnerships

- 20. The **changes at GEO Secretariat** will likely have an impact on CEOS, and task reporting status should be brought up to date to ensure the correct information is taken into account.
- 21. The GEO Secretariat Director should be engaged as early as possible in a **CEOS-GEO leadership-level dialogue**, including for the January-February CEOS-GEO Work Planning coordination meetings.
- 22. A transition plan for sustained GEO-LEO activities within CEOS will be considered for SIT-34.

Work Planning and Close

- 23. The process for updating the 2019-2021 CEOS 3-Year Work Plan was agreed.
- 24. Likely **Plenary decision items on the CEOS Carbon Strategy, the GHG White Paper, and Digital Earth Africa** were raised during the workshop.
- 25. The **objectives of VNSC as CEOS Chair** were presented, including an activity to expand Vietnam Data Cube to a Mekong river basin regional scale activity, and incorporating additional ARD data streams.

- Data Preservation and Stewardship
 - White Paper on Data Stewardship Reference Model and Measuring Earth Observation Data Usage Best Practice being drafted. Presentation finalization expected during WGISS#46 meeting (22-25 October).
 - Proposal for Data Management Principles Implementation Guidelines (DMP IG) update on the basis of CEOS WGISS Maturity Matrix being drafted. Dedicated session foreseen during the GEOSS-WGISS Interoperability and Future Data Architectures workshop (WGISS#46).
- Data Discovery and Access (WGISS Connected Data Assets Activities)
 - A simplified procedure to allow collections/granules discovery and access through FedEO and automatic registration in IDN has been finalised and is being used to increase number of partners and collections and in different cooperation activities.

- Additional DLR data collections will be accessible at granule level through FedEO and automatically registered in IDN.
- Activities started with JAXA for discovery/access through WGISS CDA and automatic registration in IDN.
- National Remote Sensing Center of China (NRSCC) has confirmed possibility of metadata harvesting between WGISS Connected Data Assets (CDA) and ChinaGEOSS platform on a periodical basis. Tests with CWIC are starting.
- GEOSS team confirmed the feasibility to explicitly add CEOS IDN in the catalogues accessible through the GEOSS Platform. This will increase visibility of CEOS contribution to GEO/GEOSS.
- CEOS OpenSearch Conformance Test Document finalised and released on 28/08/2018.
- WGISS Connected Data Assets Client Partner document to describe process to access WGISS CDA from client portals being drafted.
- Interoperability and Use
 - Future Data Architectures:
 - FDA actions included in the CEOS 2018-2020 Work-plan and assigned to WGISS are being actively discussed and addressed by WGISS members with substantial progress. Dedicated slots and sessions being organised at WGISS#46.
 - Open source Software and tools inventory lists more than 40 items; DB implementation solution is under analysis in coordination with SEO.
 - First version of FDA inventory table produced.
 - New version of the CEOS WGISS Carbon Portal was issued in September and is incorporating all preliminary inputs/feedbacks received so far. Next version is going to be issued by mid of October based on additional feedback and use cases to be received by the RECCAP team.
- Technology Exploration:

- WGCV-44 meeting was held August 28-31 at EUMETSAT in Darmstadt, Germany. Key results were
 - Unanimous agreement on the nomination of Akihiko Kuze (JAXA) to the CEOS Plenary as new Vice Chair. A letter of support from JAXA has been provided to WGCV Chair Thome.
 - WGCV-44 served as the informal WGCV handover of the Chair position of Thome (NASA) to the incoming chair C. Ong of CSIRO with the official changeover taking place at the CEOS Plenary in Brussels.
 - Work on the WGCV and subgroup websites over the past 12 months was agreed by the membership as sufficient to complete CV-1
 - An organizing committee is finalizing a June 2019 workshop on pre-flight calibration techniques to address CV-03.
 - A summary of the recently published peer-reviewed results from the Atmospheric Correction Intercomparison Experiment (ACIX) was accepted and once placed on the WGCV web site will complete CV-13.
 - A Cloud Mask Intercomparison Exercise (CMIX) will have its initial meeting in October 2018 to define the parameters of an intercomparison that will address CV-14.
 - Short-term activities were identified to define Level 1 top-of-atmosphere interoperability activities to address CV-15 leading to completion of the action by WGCV-45 that will occur in May 2019.
 - A website pointer to the WGCV solar irradiance spectrum will complete CEOS Action CV-16.
- Members from the Atmospheric Composition Subgroup participated in the ACVC meeting held in Washington, DC. Discussions relevant to WGCV input included geophysical requirements for geostationary and air quality satellite sensors as well as progress on harmonising and QA for climate variables.

- A surface reflectance validation workshop was sponsored by Geosciences Australia in Brisbane, Australia August 16-17. The documentation of the effort is the basis for the WGCV protocol development for evaluating CARD4L surface reflectance products and is part of WGCV's CV-17 CEOS Work Plan Action
- A joint telecon between WGISS and WGCV members was held September 6 to discuss progress on the joint activities between the two working groups from their meeting in Brazil held in April. A follow-on telecon is scheduled for December.
- A proposed approach for WGCV to help LSI-VC with evaluation of CARD4L data products was presented at the LSI-VC-6 meeting.
