WGISS-47 meeting successfully held in Silver Spring (hosted by NOAA) with 66 registered participants.

- Dedicated presentations from WGCV, WGCapD, WGClimate and SDG-AHT chair: way forward on ongoing and new cooperation activities discussed and agreed:
 - Cooperation with WGCV mainly focussing on the use of data cubes in support to CAL/VAL activities and on the CEOS data Maturity Matrix. Two data cube prototypes (ESA and GA/CSIRO) are being used to access ACIX (16 sites), RadCalNet (4 sites) and LPV (3 sites) sites cal/val data. WGCV is also providing detailed feedback on data quality aspects defined in the CEOS WGISS Maturity Matrix;
 - Cooperation with WGCapD for technology and user oriented webinars (<u>Action FDA-05</u> <u>and DATA-11</u>); next webinars will address FDA Elements demonstrations and ARD for Scientific communities and researchers;
 - Cooperation with *WGClimate* on ECV/CDR datasets registration in IDN as first step for accessibility through WGISS Connected Data Assets Infrastructure (<u>Action DATA-09</u>).
 Registration will be implemented through collecting relevant information from data providers during the ECV Inventory update to V3;
 - Cooperation with SDG-AHT on accessibility of CEOS agencies datasets relevant for SDG Indicators through WGISS Connected Data Assets and on discoverability/accessibility of relevant SW tools and services.
- Dedicated discussion on cooperation with *Carbon Team* on prototype carbon portal development (<u>Action CARB-15</u>). Carbon portal Version 1 has implemented all preliminary feedback received from users and will be released in May. Coordination ongoing with VAST for possible use to support a case study on forest monitoring in the Mekong area. NOAA continuation of support ensured until end 2019. Next team teleconference and teleconference with VAST team planned by end May 2019. Carbon Portal handover and governance after final release to be defined.

Rob Woodcock chaired the CEOS organised session and participated to the 3rd Expert Advisory Group meeting.

- Data Preservation and Stewardship Session
 - Dedicated session on CEOS agencies EO thesauri: mostly based on GCMD, agreement to cooperate in GCMD thesauri improvement inside WGISS.

- Proposal for GEO Data Management Principles Implementation Guidelines (DMP IG) improvement/update in relation to CEOS WGISS Maturity Matrix will be sent to GEO.
- Discussed potential improvement of CEOS WGISS maturity matrix to include FAIR principles and to consider relevant work done in the Research for Data Alliance (RDA) and World Meteorological Organization (WMO) Expert Group on Data Management.
- Data Discovery and Access Session (WGISS Connected Data Assets Activities, Action DATA-2)
 - Implementation of a map based front-end/portal within the IDN for CEOS data discovery and access discussed and agreed, approach to be further assessed.
 - 150 EO data collections from JAXA have been registered in IDN, access at granule level through FedEO will be implemented in the upcoming months.
 - NOAA OneStop datasets being registered/updated in the International Directory Network (IDN) and granule search/access is being implemented through CWIC.
 - CWIC tests with National Remote Sensing Center of China (NRSCC) ChinaGEOSS platform for metadata harvesting to be started.
 - Additional ESA Earth Explorers and Heritage Missions data collections were made available through FedEO.
 - FedEO activities progressing with DLR and EUMETSAT and to be resumed with ROSCOSMOS.

- As per the SIT-34 minutes, there is an action for CEOS agencies to demonstrate their support to the proposed streamlined approach SIT-34-08: "Any agency that is ready and able to support one, two, three, any or all of the 6.6.1, 11.3.1, and 15.3.1 Indicators are asked to indicate interest to the Co-Leads of the SDG AHT". Except NASA (plans to continue working on indicators 6.6.1 and 11.3.1 for the satellite requirements table), no interest registered so far.
- This new approach (focus on 3 indicators first) and work with CEOS existing bodies has been proposed at SIT. But the future of the existing "AHT" is still unclear, especially with the new CEOS WG led by SIT Chair. Co-leads are seeking more clarity.

- SDG AHT organised a side-meeting just before SIT-34 in Miami: Marc P. Alex H. and Flora K. were leading the discussions about SDG and Agencies updates and way forward for the team. ~15-20 participated in the meeting including CSA, EC, NASA, JAXA, NOAA, ESA, CSIRO, US Department.
 - Updates from SDG co-leads & Flora (Status of actions incl. "Compendium": complete, but will update when required);
 GEO/NASA/EO4SDG (Lawrence F.), EC. (Mark D.)
 - Discussions around GEO WP and CEOS activities
 - New streamlined approach to focus (as a start only) on 3 indicators (same as selected by WGGI), but hope to work on other soon
 - Call for Agencies to show their support to work on those
 - Discussion with SIT Chair/NOAA: future of the team, where to fit in their proposed new WG, eg. a light-weight coordination body to keep the engagement work with external stakeholders and represent CEOS in key

- strategic high-level and working groups at UN level? + Coordinate SDG activities (focus on specific indicator) with existing bodies.
- GEO LDN initiative (part of SDG team) (Neil S., CSIRO, attended a LDN meeting in Bonn): there are three working groups in the Initiative:
 - WG1 capacity building: this will establish the mechanisms for capacity building more than 'do; the capacity building per se, and will focus on Africa initially (lead here is Amos Kabobah from Ghana). Establishing the mechanisms is seen as facilitating a more enduring capacity build than just running a series of training exercises, for example.
 - WG2 data quality standards (lead is Antje Hecheltjen GIZ). This will follow on from the GPG we wrote for 15.3.1 and aim to identify the requirements of data sets to be suitable for use in 15.3.1 and LDN assessment. Ultimately, this will be an important guide for the revision of the GPG
 - WG3 (Neil and And Alex Zvoleff) this will aim to build a federated collaborative analytics platform (essentially build on Trends.Earth) to further improve the flexibility and accessibility of tools for calculating 15.3.1 and LDN.
 - In WG3 the plan is to use the CEOS LDN network as the science advisory committee for the GEO LDN one. So, the plan is to use that community to review funding proposals, and perhaps conduct some reviews of existing infrastructure etc.
- In the upcoming SIT Chair team (CSIRO/GA, Australia), Neil S. and Flora K. (CSIRO) will likely look after the efforts towards the SDG in CEOS, one of the team's priorities.
- EO for the Pacific including SDG focus, recent discussions in Australia: CSIRO and other partners (GA, DFAT, Embassy of France, EU representation...) want to launch a one-year designing phase (extensive consultation with Pacific Islands) to assess their needs, and keeping in mind technical issues and political context
 - Call for stories (GEO Sec): invited representatives of GEO Flagships, Initiatives, Community Activities and Foundational Tasks to submit stories related to results achieved during the years 2016 to 2019. Based on submissions, the GEO Secretariat will select stories for inclusion in the 2016-2019 GEO Report on Impact, to be presented at the GEO-XVI Plenary and Ministerial Summit in Canberra, Australia.
 - => Opportunity for CEOS SDG AHT to submit stories from Agencies?
- Preparation of the Agora session on SDG indicators (Marc P.)
- Ongoing/active discussions with WGISS, SEO (Data Cube algorithms on 3 indicators) and WGCapD (discusions with NASA GSFC WQ team: planning an in person training as part of the AmeriGEO week in August (Aug 19-23) in Lima, Peru).
