New updates, particularly those that would benefit from CEOS SEC awareness, discussion, help and/or guidance:

1. Participation in GCOS Steering Committee Meeting

WGClimate participated in the Global Climate Observing System (GCOS) Steering Committee meeting, held at INPE from July 7–10, 2025. At the meeting, GCOS decided that the next *Status Report* and *Implementation Plan* will be developed and published concurrently, with a target release in Q1 2027. This timing is intended to inform the second Global Stocktake in 2028.

- The *Status Report* will be a concise summary targeting policymakers, accompanied by a separate, detailed technical annex.
- The *Implementation Plan* will be a focused document outlining a small number of high-priority actions.
- A new set of Essential Climate Variable (ECV) requirements will be published separately in Q4 2028.

2. SBSTA 62 Outcomes

The 62nd session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) took place in Bonn, Germany, from June 16–26, 2025. Statements from GCOS, the IPCC, the World Climate Research Programme, and the World Meteorological Organization were included in the opening plenary. Key takeaways include:

- SBSTA reaffirmed the importance of sustained, systematic observation of the climate system as a foundation for scientific research.
- SBSTA welcomed progress in the IPCC's Seventh Assessment Cycle, including ongoing work on:
 - o The Seventh Assessment Report,
 - o A methodological report on short-lived climate forcers,
 - o A Special Report on Climate Change and Cities,
 - And encouraged initiation of a methodological report on carbon dioxide removal (CDR) and carbon capture, utilization, and storage (CCUS).
- The importance of enhancing inclusivity and regional representation in IPCC activities was emphasized.
- SBSTA highlighted the value of the research dialogue in delivering current scientific knowledge, identifying gaps and needs, and addressing research capacity constraints—particularly in developing countries, least developed countries, and small island developing States.
- Scientific needs were noted across several thematic areas, including:
 - o Multi-hazard impacts of global warming,
 - o Advances and gaps in attribution science,
 - o Research needs and gaps in modeling sustainable mitigation pathways,

- o Deployment of Carbon Dioxide Removal technologies,
- o Science-based greenhouse gas reporting methodologies for carbon accounting.

3. UNFCCC Engagement Activities

- The WGClimate UNFCCC engagement team is preparing key messages for Earth Information Day and coordinating participation in events at COP 30.
- The COP 30 Side Events and Exhibits Online Registration System (SEORS) opened for applications on July 16 and will close on July 21, 2025. All submissions must be authorized by the applicant's National Focal Point or Designated Contact Point by July 28. Additional information is available at https://seors.unfccc.int.

4. CEOS-CGMS Statement to SBSTA 63

WGClimate is drafting the CEOS-CGMS Statement on Progress in Supporting UNFCCC Needs for Global Observations for the 63rd SBSTA session. The 2025 statement will emphasize knowledge gained from sustained Earth observation in the following key thematic areas:

- Earth's energy imbalance
- Land cover change and ecosystem dynamics
- Ice loss and glacier retreat
- Sea level rise monitoring and projection
- Early warning and disaster response

WGClimate is also seeking recent examples of how space-based observations are supporting national inventory reporting (e.g., Biennial Transparency Reports) and adaptation planning.

5. Update to WGClimate Terms of Reference

WGClimate is currently reviewing and updating its Terms of Reference to reflect evolving priorities and activities.

Upcoming meetings and events (for written reference only):

- WGClimate and GHG Task Team will meet with the CGMS Working Groups, ahead of CGMS Plenary on June 2, 2025. A draft agenda has been proposed.
- A side meeting at SIT Technical Workshop 2025 will be arranged to discuss space-based ocean carbon measurements with GCOS.
- WGClimate-23 will be held as a virtual meeting on Friday October 24, 2025.
- WGClimate-24 will be held jointly with the GCOS Panels the week of February 9, 2026, in Harwell, UK.

CEOS Entity: Working Group on Calibration and Validation (WGCV)

WGCV-55 took place last week in Hyderabad, India (8-11 July 2025). Lively and productive
discussions featured in sessions including the CEOS-FRM Assessment Framework, subgroup and
agency reports, CEOS-ARD, data quality, the CEOS Product Validation Platform, the WGISS
Interoperability Handbook, and WMO GSICS. WGCV thanks ISRO for hosting this excellent meeting.

- A commercial engagement session on Thursday 10 July was attended by six Indian commercial companies, who shared their current Cal/Val activities and challenges, as well as their usage of CEOS initiatives like RadCalNet and CEOS-ARD.
 - Newspace India Ltd. (liaison between ISRO and the Indian commercial sector), SatSure, KaleidEO (SatSure subsidiary), Azista Aerospace, Pixxel, and Antaris Space. SatSure and Pixxel were very knowledgeable wrt CEOS, WGCV, and CEOS-ARD. Pixxel uses RadCalNet frequently.
- Actions taken in the meeting aim to increase communication and sharing of WGCV initiatives and subgroup activities, advance the FRM Assessment Framework and Product Validation Platform, and continue developing guidance and protocols for Land Product Validation, pre-flight calibration, and data quality.
- WGCV endorsed Version 2 of the Roadmap towards an Assessment Framework for CEOS-Fiducial Reference Measurements (FRMs), as well as the Land Cover and Change Map Accuracy Assessment and Area Estimation Good Practices Protocol (subject to final feedback).
- WGCV-56 will be held at USGS EROS in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, US, in April 2026. The prospect of holding this meeting jointly with LSI-VC-19 is being considered.

New updates, particularly those that would benefit from CEOS SEC awareness, discussion, help and/or guidance

• On June 18, the WGGIS and WG Disasters Chairs along with Nitant Dube, Lorant Czaran, Libby Rose, Ana Medico and Marcelo Uriburu Quirno, held a teleconference. We discussed the possibility of holding another joint meeting again (as we did in April/2023). WG Disasters proposed holding it in March next year, coinciding with the WG Disasters meeting number 25, during the terms of Lorant Czaran's (from UNOOSA) as WGDisasters Chair, and Nitant Dube's (from ISRO) as WGISS Chair. Lorant mentioned that he was planning to hold WGD-25 in Europe, with Bonn or Vienna as possible options, and that UNSPIDER could also be involved in this meeting as an observer. One possible common topic for the meeting could be the concept of 'Decision-Ready' products, which combine a variety of datasets to provide information to decision makers.

Additionally, Lorant may also be able to join the WGISS-60 meeting in person.

- Two people from Kenya joined the WG Disasters: Paul Mwangi who is a Geospatial Analyst at the Disaster Risk Reduction Section of the Regional Centre for Mapping of Resources for Development (RCMRD) and James Wanjohi Nyaga who is the Head of the Section. They expressed interest in joining the WG Disasters to explore potential collaborations from their Centre. We will meet them next week discuss the scope of this collaboration. WG Disasters, sees this as very positive because they could also be added to the EW4All Subgroup.
- Two oral presentations were given at the Living Planet Sympusium 25 thanks of ASI participation:
 - Capacity Building and Technology Transfer in Earth Observation
 - Using satellite EO in global capabilities for disaster response

I saw both presentations before they were presented and they were really comprehensive, clear and nice.
