CEOS Crucial Milestones for 2009 and 2010

Second crucial milestone:

- CEOS has made a considerable effort in connecting with UNFCCC and promoting the capability of our satellites to deliver the information the policymakers need.
- COP-15 in November 2009 is a crucial policy milestone where we can demonstrate our technical capabilities in support of policy formulation and its future verification.







CEOS Crucial Milestones for 2009 and 2010

Third crucial milestone:

 Ministers will demand headline-grabbing evidence that progress is being made on the GEOSS at the GEO ministerial in late 2010 since it is the mid-point of GEOSS 10-year IP.







CEOS to Deliver Outcomes at 2 Key Events

- I urge CEOS participants in this SIT-23 to come together with the common purpose of identifying and achieving the 'demonstrable' items on the space segment.
- We need to ensure that the various subsidiary groups are working in harmony to produce outcomes that we need.

- At the end of SIT-23, I am looking forward to the indication on which of our current endeavours are most likely to yield the results that GEO and UNFCCC require.
- I would like to make 23rd CEOS Plenary in Thailand in November a more in-depth consideration of a few purposed priorities.
