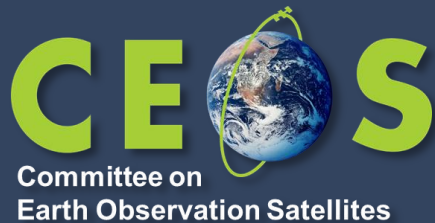

Mission Statement: The African Space Agency (AfSA) is the **continental** space agency of the **African Union**. It was established to **promote collaboration** amongst African nations and other regions in **harnessing space science and technology for Africa's socio-economic development**, promoting collaborative research and peaceful exploration of outer space.



AfSA Objectives:

One of its key objectives, as outlined in the African Space Agency Act, is to **enhance space missions across Africa**, ensuring **optimal access to space-derived data**, information, services, and products. Once fully integrated into national, regional, and continental programmes, AfSA will be crucial in **eliminating duplication and inefficiencies within the African space ecosystem**. As the official body overseeing and coordinating these efforts, it will also be responsible for **effectively implementing the African Space Policy and Strategy** and achieving the continent's space-related goals.

African Space Policy Goals:

Well-coordinated and integrated African space Programme that is responsive to the social, economic, political and environmental needs of the continent, as well as being globally competitive.

Regulatory framework that supports an African space Programme and ensures that Africa is a responsible and peaceful user of outer space.

African Space Strategy Goals:

Space-derived products and services used for decision-making and addressing the economic, political, social and environmental challenges.

An indigenous space capability, both in the private and public sectors, that defines a coordinated, effective and innovative African-led space Programme.

Addressing user needs

Harnessing the potential of space science and technology to address Africa's socio-economic opportunities and challenges.

Accessing space services

Strengthening space mission technology on the continent to ensure optimal access to space-derived data, information services and products.

Developing the regional and international market

Developing a sustainable and vibrant indigenous space industry that promotes and responds to the needs of the African continent.

Adopting good governance and management

Adopting good corporate governance and best practices for the coordinated management of continental space activities.

Coordinating the African space arena

Maximising the benefit of current and planned space activities and avoiding or minimising the duplication of resources and efforts.

Promoting international cooperation

Promoting an African-led space agenda through mutually beneficial partnerships.
